Corporate social responsibility enriches the workplace and aligns a company's values, mission, products and services to build vital relationships to the communities they serve. Barbara provides guidance to foster social activism and to engage employees in service that is meaningful and sustainable. She features a model that promotes teamwork and collaboration teaching entrepreneurs and intrapreneurs how to use their business skills to affect social change. The result is the creation of a culture of caring — an environment that is positive, inclusive, and motivates employees to reach their full potential while promoting important ethics.

#### **Promoting Multigenerational Legacies**

Many times our day-to-day responsibilities restrict our ability to spend quality time with our children and share stories, core values and ethics. Whether you are a parent, grandparent, teacher, mentor or someone who cares deeply about the next generation, teaching our children to care and give back is both a privilege and a responsibility. Too frequently we focus only on the importance of academics and athletics, but forget to develop young people's hearts. ### Remembering the Holocaust: Using Key Lessons to Move From Commemoration to Action

History too frequently repeats itself. There are invaluable lessons to be learned from the Holocaust and other genocides and how they apply in today's society. Barbara's commitment to social justice is rooted in her own legacy as the daughter of Holocaust survivors. (Her mother was the sole survivor of a family of 65 people and her father worked for Oskar Schindler.) In the early '90s, after visiting Auschwitz with her parents, she was inspired to create Champions of Caring to teach young people the universal lessons of the Holocaust: that silence and indifference are diseases that must be combatted, that we must all stand up and speak out against injustice, and that we each have a responsibility to repair the world. By sharing how her legacy has shaped her life, Barbara inspires audiences to reflect upon their own life experiences and find a way of giving back that has personal meaning.

## Resiliency and Reinvention: Gaining Strength From Life's Hardest Challenges

The curve balls and loss we experience in life can leave us wounded, depressed and feeling powerless. However, having the right attitude, confidence and knowledge can transform our most challenging events into pillars of strength.
